**ADVERB:** TELLS HOW SOMETHING IS DONE. USUALLY ENDS IN 'LY'. CAREFULLY, STUPIDLY, HAPPILY, GREEDILY, AND MODESTLY ARE ALL ADVERBS.

**NOUN:** IS A PERSON, PLACE OR THING.

**VERB:** AN ACTION WORD. RUN, PITCH, JUMP, HIKE. VERB (ED) ARE PAST TENSE VERBS LIKE RAN, PITCHED JUMPED, AND HIKED. VERB (ING) MEANS THE WORD NEEDS TO END IN (ING) LIKE SWIMMING, JUMPING, EATING, AND RUNNING.
